- The blue and silver pinwheel is the national symbol for child abuse prevention. During April, Child Abuse Prevention Month, we are taking part in the pinwheel campaign, so we can educate others on how to keep families and children safe.
- The pinwheel is used as a symbol to represent the bright future all children deserve.
- The pinwheel is a reminder for everyone to take action to help families and children stay safe.
- This is a time to celebrate families and children.
- It is a time for the community to come together and support safe and healthy children and families.
- The pinwheel symbolizes the wish for a safe and positive childhood for all children. Think about ways you can be a positive role model for your friends and other children you know.
- Identify at least one caring adult, more if possible, you can talk to if you have any problems or concerns.
