

About Us



The hospital, originally founded by the Sisters of Charity of Nazareth, has been offering hope to individuals and families struggling with substance use disorders or co-occurring behavioral health disorders since 1951. We are one of the largest behavioral health hospitals in the nation and the largest and most comprehensive private provider of youth inpatient behavioral health services in the country.

We offer specialty programs for children and adolescents who have complex treatment needs, such as intellectual or developmental disabilities; forensic issues for females; and/or co-occurring substance use issues. Patients come to Peace Hospital from all over Kentucky and the surrounding region. Our work is funded in part by generous donors, such as Kosair Charities and the WHAS Crusade for Children.



Specialized Treatment Services

Peace Hospital's Innovations Program includes Board-Certified Behavior Analysts, an Occupational Therapist, a Speech and Language Pathologist and Intervention and Program Specialists. This group of clinical staff members provides services to the children and adolescents with intellectual and developmental disabilities and highly aggressive females. Also, *Riding for Peace* provides equine therapy services to these same patients.

In addition, we are staffed with highly-credentialed professionals including Board Certified Psychiatrists, Nurse Practitioners, Licensed Clinical Therapists, Licensed Clinical Alcohol and Drug Counselors, Registered Nurses, Pastoral Counselors and Activity Therapists with years of training and experience that comprise our specialized treatment teams.
