

## Lean on Me Kentucky

Focus Group Summary Report

## **Statewide Report**

The Lean on Me Kentucky focus groups were held statewide, in each of the nine DCBS regions from May 26, 2022, to July 7, 2022. Participants were recruited to participate in the focus groups by PCAK Partners in Prevention across the state.

- · Salt River Trail Region- Children's Alliance
- Southern Bluegrass Region- The Nest
- The Lakes Region- Lotus Children's Advocacy & Sexual Violence Resource Center
- · Two Rivers Region- Family Enrichment Center

110 participants in total attended the focus group, representing community members, program participants, Parent Education program participants, and staff members of our partner agencies. Participants represented diverse experiences, cultures, and backgrounds. Many participants engaged throughout the focus group and 55 individuals completed the Survey Monkey after the focus group, resulting in 165 individuals' feedback reflected in this summary report.

Focus group participants were asked to respond to the following 6 questions:



- . What does community mean to you?
- 2. What can members of this community do to value, strengthen, and support parents and families?
- 3. What can members of this community do to respond when they see a family having a tough time?
- What can members of this community do to help families make healthy and supportive connections?
  - 5. It is important for children to interact in a positive way with others, understand and communicate their feelings, and regulate their behavior. How can members of this community help children develop these social and emotional skills?
- 6. What can members of this community do to connect families to available resources?

## Themes

Themes emerged throughout the narratives shared during our focus group questions and the Survey Monkey responses.

- 1. Reduce stigmas associated with needing support (ex: services, mental health supports, parent education classes, etc.)
- 2. Decrease barriers to access services and programs provided to community members
- 3. Ask if help is needed and be specific in your offering of assistance to families having a tough time
- 4. Ensure services are inclusive and accessible to all families in need of support, regardless of language spoken, background, abilities, income level, or employment status
- 5. Support families in your community through modeling behaviors, mentoring, volunteering, and donating (physical goods or monetary gifts)
- 6. Advocate for additional safe, happy, healthy, and low-cost community centers, childcare facilities, grocery stores, medical facilities, and community supports in your neighborhoods
