- The theme of 2024 Child Abuse Prevention Month is "Building A Hopeful Future, Together."
- Throughout Child Abuse Prevention Month, Prevent Child Abuse Kentucky is building a narrative of hope for children and families through collaboration and the creation of an ecosystem of primary prevention. Communities must build positive futures together in partnership.
- Each day is an opportunity to build the foundation for our future. But we know we can't do this alone we all have a role to play as healthy partners in our communities.
- Building healthy communities takes work. We all have a responsibility to ensure children have positive experiences, and help families have the resources they need, when they need them.
- Strong communities are built on stable foundations. Everyone benefits when we focus on addressing underlying causes that lead to health and social inequities.
- Policies and programs that put families first build all of us up during stressful times. Working in partnership can allow us to relieve some of the overload experienced by parents and caregivers.
- Children who live in families with access to economic and concrete support are less likely to experience abuse and neglect.
- All children, parents, and families should be able to access the support and resources they need, when they need it, in their own communities, without stigma before they are in crisis.
- Prevention is possible and everyone plays a role.
- Challenging life circumstances can overload and overburden parents and caregivers. Just like
 how a vehicle burdened with too much weight may be unable to move forward, overburdened
 parents and caregivers may be unable to provide the necessary care and support to their
 children.
- Community support and partnerships can help lighten the burden on families.

Proclamations

A great way to spread the word about Child Abuse Prevention Month is to get your local elected and/or appointed officials to issue a proclamation. Prevent Child Abuse Kentucky will be getting proclamations from the Kentucky General Assembly recognizing Child Abuse Prevention Month in the commonwealth. We encourage you to reach out to your local political leaders to get proclamations recognizing CAPM in your area. You can use the example below as a starting point.

Child Abuse Prevention Month 2023 Proclamation

Whereas, National Child Abuse Prevention Month will be recognized throughout the United States, as well as in the Commonwealth of Kentucky during the month of April, 2023; and

Whereas, preventing child abuse and neglect is a community problem that depends on involvement among people throughout the community; and

Whereas, during periods of economic challenges, families feel more vulnerable, and as a result, child abuse and neglect increases drastically; and

Whereas, child abuse and neglect can be reduced by making sure each family has the support they need to raise their children in a healthy environment; and

Whereas, child abuse is considered to be one of our nation's most serious public health problems with scientific studies documenting the link between the abuse and neglect of children and a wide range of medical, emotional, psychological and behavioral disorders; and

Whereas, all citizens should become involved in strengthening families to raise their children in a safe and nurturing environment; and

Whereas, effective child abuse prevention programs succeed because of partnerships created among state and local government agencies, schools, faith communities, civic organizations, law enforcement agencies, and the business community; and

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved, that I, Dan Mosley, do hereby proclaim the month of April 2023 Child Abuse Prevention Month in Harlan County, Kentucky. I urge all citizens, community agencies, faith groups, medical facilities, and businesses to increase their participation in our efforts to strengthen families, thereby preventing child abuse and creating healthier communities.

Creating your own activities

PCAK encourages you to get creative with your Child Abuse Prevention Month activities. We've listed some ideas below to get you started!

- Draw positive messages in chalk on sidewalks.
- Hang up blue ribbons around your town or city.
- Host a t-shirt making or drawing competition to involve kids in CAPM.
- Sell paper pinwheels for \$1 or any increment with proceeds going to PCAK. Let us know and we can supply the pinwheels.
- Use your voice! While elected officials are back in their home districts in April, it is a great time to connect with them.
- Plant Pinwheels! Blue and silver pinwheels are the national symbol for child abuse and neglect prevention. Help us cover the Commonwealth in blue this April by planting pinwheels in your community. Please avoid equating pinwheels with abuse substantiations or child fatalities, and instead use positive imagery such as families served by your organization.



Letters to the Editor

Submit a letter to the editor of your local paper. Keep your letters short and focused. Be sure to include a call to action whether it is to support specific legislation or to learn more about a program. You may also highlight actions individuals, agencies and groups take to help families.

Relate Programs to Prevention

Given the public and media's tendency to think about child abuse in its worst forms, it is important to emphasize that prevention is possible. When highlighting stories of successful prevention strategies, it is important to connect the dots from the program to the prevention of child abuse. Let the public know how they can help.

Ask Local Media to Run a Parenting Series in April

Ask for your local paper to run a four-week series on parenting and child development throughout the month of April. Seek stories of families who have overcome challenges, successfully completed parenting classes, or reached positive milestones as a result of receiving local community services.

Stay on Message

Narrow your message to one or two central points. You do not have to answer every question a reporter poses. Answer questions in such a way it reflects your key message. Do not repeat something a reporter says that is not part of your point. Emphasize child abuse is a problem with solutions that don't receive the attention they should. Explain the solutions. Refer to the talking points in this guide for guidance.
